

We warmly welcome you as we gather here today for our service of worship and fellowship together.

I found it interesting this week while preparing for this service to discover that some of the earliest images used in Christian art are not that of Jesus sacrifice on the cross but the image of the "Good Shepherd". It was actually a few hundred years after the resurrection of Jesus that the church and Christian art began using the "Crucified One" as the main image of our faith. Nevertheless, the image of the Good Shepherd is still a powerful one full of meaning and depth for us today.

The image of Israel's leader as a shepherd is ancient. 2 Samuel 7.4-9 acknowledges that David was a shepherd. Isaiah 40.11 informs us that the Messiah, 'will feed his flock like a shepherd; he will gather the lambs in his arms.' However, the rulers of Israel are often described as bad or false shepherds as in Ezekiel 34.1-10. In response, God says that he himself will be their shepherd and later in that same passage that he will be our saviour (v.22), and will set a shepherd over us. All of this background reading feeds into today's Gospel.

Ultimately the Good Shepherd watches over the full life of His Sheep and brings lambs into life, gives them life and journeys with them through life. Even through the dark valley of death on into eternal life. Jesus comes to offer us life, a full life, a life with a purpose and meaning, to be lived out to the full. Will you accept his call to come and follow Him?


