The Link Book Group


Our latest book was a non fiction account entitled *Lumberjills Britain's Forgotten Army* by Joanna Foat.

When war was declared in 1939, Britain was almost completely dependent on imported timber - but only had a few months of it stockpiled. Timber was crucial to the war effort and was needed for everything from aircraft and shipbuilders to communications and coal mining. The British timber trade was in serious trouble. So the Lumberjills (the subject of our new book) came to the rescue (ie the female equivalent to Lumberjacks!)



Because most of the male population was required to staff the armed forces, the Government was forced to open lumberwork for women to apply and apply they did. The women's Timber Corps had thousands of members who would prove themselves just as strong and as smart as any man. They felled and crosscut trees by hand, operated sawmills and ran whole forestry sites. In the midst of heavy labour and wartime, they lived their lives making friends and finding soulmates. In this book, researcher Joanna Foat recounts their story for the first time and helps to give them the recognition they so truly deserve. Our group found this account very interesting and informative. Each of the contributors gave fascinating stories of comradeship amidst adversity and there were many stories of candour, humour, trials and tragedies in each individual reminiscences.

Sometimes the stories were a bit repetitive but that did not detract from the book. Altogether a wonderful account about this "Forgotten Army" and a great example of female fortitude and tenacity. They certainly could not be regarded as "The Weaker Sex!"

Picnic on the Grass (Chapter 2)


The recently reinstated Reflections' Group met on the 26th June.

HOW SHOULD I PRAY?

There are no rules or limits to prayer but only what works best for you. Some people find it easiest in the morning before doing anything else. Others find it easier to have a coffee and pray during the day for others it may be the last thing you do at night. You can also do all three if you want.



Set aside a time that works for you and PRAY.

- P** — Pause be still, and acknowledge that God is with you even if you don't feel anything, God is close to you there. Trust in him.
We often rush on to asking, so take time to be still and know.
- R** - Rejoice and give thanks. Be grateful and rejoice for who Jesus is, for what he has done for us as our Lord and Saviour.
Be thankful too for answered prayers, family or other blessings
- A** - Ask, we pray for the world and its people, the Church and its witness and mission, for our family and friends and for ourselves. Be real in your prayers, speak from your heart.
- Y** - Yield to Christ's Lordship. Otherwise known as saying yes to Jesus.
We pray Thy Kingdom Come, Thy will be done.
Say Yes to what Jesus is calling you to do.
If it is to bless others then bless them, to give then give,
Say yes to Jesus and love one another.
