The Lenten call

The holy season of Lent as a time of preparation for the great feast of Easter has been observed since the early days of our Christians faith.

I invite you, therefore, in the name of our Lord, to confess your sins with penitence and faith and to turn again to Christ our Saviour and Redeemer. Therefore I ask you these questions.

Do you renounce evil? I renounce evil.

Do you repent of sin? I repent of my sin.

Do you turn to Christ? I turn to Christ.

Will you follow Christ? I will follow Christ.

Heavenly Father,
we acknowledge
that we have not loved
as you would have us love.
We return to you
and ask for your mercy,
forgive us and renew us
through Jesus Christ our Lord.

God, who is both power and love, forgives us and free us from our sins, heal and strengthen us by his Spirit, and raise us to new life in Christ our Lord. **Amen.**

Collect

God of patience and humility, in your love you gave your Son to be rejected and raised up on a cross. Gather us under its shadow and open our eyes to its mystery, that we may share even now in the life that is from above; through Jesus Christ our Lord, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever.

The Peace

As we commemorate God's love we meet in Christ's name; Let us share his peace.

Hymn

BEHOLD THE LAMB who bears our sins away Slain for us, - and we remember the promise made that all who come in faith find forgiveness at the cross So we share in this bread of life, and we drink of His sacrifice as a sign of our bonds of peace around the table of the king

So we share in this bread of life, and we drink of His sacrifice as a sign of our bonds of grace around the table of the king

And so with thankfulness and faith we rise, to respond and to remember, our call to follow in the steps of Christ as His body here on earth As we share in His suffering, we proclaim Christ will come again And we'll join in the feast of heaven around the table of the King

Offering

As we gather at this table we present our offerings to the Lord.

Yours Lord is the greatness, the power, the glory, the splendour and the majesty; for everything in heaven and on earth is yours.
All things come from you and of your own we give you.

The Eucharistic Prayer

The Lord is here. **His Spirit is with us.**

Lift up your hearts.

We lift them to the Lord.

Let us give thanks to the Lord our God. It is right to give thanks and praise.

Worship and praise belong to you, In every place and at all times.

When we turned away you did not reject us but came to meet us in your Son. You embraced us as your children and welcomed us to sit and eat with you.

(we sit or kneel as the prayer continues)

We remember that on the night Of the great Passover feast Jesus at supper with his disciples took bread, and gave you thanks; he broke the bread and gave it to them, saying: Take, eat; this is my body which is broken for you; do this in remembrance of me.

Father we do this in remembrance of him his body is the bread of life.

At the end of the Passover meal taking the cup of wine,
Our Lord gave you thanks, and said:
Drink this, all of you;
this is my blood of the new covenant, it is poured our for you and for all,
That sins may be forgiven;
do this in remembrance of me.
Father we do this
in remembrance of him

his blood is shed for all.

As members of your community of faith we offer you this sacrifice of praise, with angels and archangels and the whole company of heaven singing they hymn of your unending glory

Holy, holy, holy Lord, God of power and might, Heaven and earth are full of your glory. Hosanna in the highest. Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord Hosanna in the highest.

As we remember our Lord's sacrificial death and celebrate his rising in glory, we pray come Holy Spirit rekindle in us the fire of your love, and bless us through these gifts of bread and wine

As we eat and drink these holy gifts make us one in Christ, our risen Lord.
