# Welcome to St Mary's

We warmly welcome you as we gather this morning to worship the Lord and to enjoy a time of fellowship together as his people.

This morning we give a special welcome to Tim Tunley who is the Chaplain of the Mission to the Seafarers in Scotland. Tim and a team of honorary volunteer chaplains offer care and emergency assistance in 76 ports around Scotland to seafarers of all ranks, nationalities and beliefs.

He endeavours to visit around a dozen ships each week and sees about 60 crew members as part of the work of the organisation, which is the largest international seafarers' charity in the world.

Tim, is quick to dispel the myth that sailors are nomadic characters, indulging in an unfettered life. He said: "I have met very few people who have been to sea because they love the sea. Almost everyone I meet is at sea because they love their families." Many of these sailors can be away from home for many months or years at a time. The Mission to Seafarers works around the globe and here in Scotland to be a loving neighbour and help to all of them in Jesus name.

I pray that our Lord will touch and guide you and Tim as we worship together and give thanks for all who work and labour on the sea.

So, as we do what he commanded us to do, we open our hearts to him; we remember how he died and rose again to live now in us.

Together with him we offer you these gifts: in them we give you ourselves.

Send now your Holy Spirit on us and on this bread and this wine; that they may be to us the Body and Blood of Christ, and that, sharing your life, we may travel in your company to our journey's end.

With all your people we give you thanks and praise through the Son and in the Spirit, now and for ever. Amen.
