How are you doing? Is there anything troubling you? Please do remember that your Pastoral Teams and Clergy are here for you. Although we cannot have physical contact we are happy to chat on the Phone or even have a video call. Remember our buildings may be closed but the Church, her people are still active , praying and caring for you.

Our Gospel reading for this Sunday takes us to John chapter 14 verses 1-14. There we find Jesus gathered with his disciples on the evening before his crucifixion, and as Jesus speaks he shares some of his last words and thoughts with those at supper with him. Jesus fully aware of what awaits him in the morning wants to prepare and comfort his disciples. The days ahead will bring many trials and tribulations as well as moments of wonder, awe and new life. A great change is about to happen and things will not be as they once were. Jesus encourages his friends to take heart, and not to become overly worried but to place their trust afresh in him who is the great I am, the way the truth and the life!

We too are going through a period of forced change. Yes, there might be glimpses of an end but I sense we will not be set free to how things once were but be released, in time, into a new way of cautious living.

Therefore, the words of Jesus even today ring true for us as his friends, his disciples. We are not to let our hearts be troubled but to trust in Jesus as our Lord and God. Like the disciples adjusting to the new reality that Jesus had died, was buried and now was living again we too need to adjust to our new circumstances and the new ways we may have to shop, or travel and even interact. What will church services look like in the coming months. There are many unanswered questions but let us face the day seeking to follow our Lord's word, living by his truth and rejoicing in the life he gives us.

Do not let your hearts be troubled turn to God in prayer and with faith hold onto his promises that he is with us, and is preparing a place for us as well . Remember too that you can turn to God's family to for help and a chat. For we are part of his family, members of God's household and are here to love and care for one another whatever the days ahead may bring






want to run to the door and bark and greet you in person and not just look at you on the screen.

The Gospel John 14:1-14 Jacqui

*When the Gospel is announced we say
Glory to Christ our Saviour*

“Do not let your hearts be troubled. You believe in God; believe also in me. My Father’s house has many rooms; if that were not so, would I have told you that I am going there to prepare a place for you? And if I go and prepare a place for you, I will come back and take you to be with me that you also may be where I am. You know the way to the place where I am going.” Thomas said to him, “Lord, we don’t know where you are going, so how can we know the way?”

Jesus answered, “I am the way and the truth and the life.

No one comes to the Father except through me. If you really know me, you will know my Father as well. From now on, you do know him and have seen him.”

Philip said, “Lord, show us the Father and that will be enough for us.”

Jesus answered: “Don’t you know me, Philip, even after I have been among you such a long time? Anyone who has seen me has seen the Father. How can you say, ‘Show us the Father’? Don’t you believe that I am in the Father, and that the Father is in me? The words I say to you I do not speak on my own authority. Rather, it is the Father, living in me, who is doing his work. Believe me when I say that I am in the Father and the Father is in me; or at least believe on the evidence of the works themselves.

Very truly I tell you, whoever believes in me will do the works I have been doing, and they will do even greater things than these, because I am going to the Father. And I will do whatever you ask in my name, so that the Father may be glorified in the Son. You may ask me for anything in my name, and I will do it.
