# A Rector's Musings

Sometimes as a Minister I struggle to find the right words or way to communicate some of the great wonders and mysteries of God after all no one can fathom the wisdom of God. Isaiah the prophet writes:

Why do you moan and worry O people! Why do you say,  
"My way is hidden from the Lord; my cause is disregarded!"  
Do you not know? Have you not heard?  
The Lord is the everlasting God, the Creator of the ends of the earth.  
He will not grow tired or weary,  
and his understanding no one can fathom.  
He gives strength to the weary and increases the power of the weak.

*Isaiah 40:27-29*

Do you know God? Have you heard the Good News?

Jesus himself often used stories, parables to give us a glimpse of what the Kingdom of God is like and for many of us learning about God comes from reading the stories in the Bible. But there are also some modern day stories that help illustrate and teach us about the love and grace of God. Julie one of the Mum's who comes to Messy Church shared this story on Facebook .

While shopping I Was at Costco I heard a loud crash and something shattering. Being nosy, I walked towards the sound and saw some people whispering and looking back to the end of the next aisle. When I walked down that aisle, I saw an older lady had hit a shelf and many things had fallen to the ground and broke. She was kneeling on the floor embarrassed, frantically trying to clean up.

I felt so bad for her, and everyone was just standing there staring at her. So I went and knelt beside her and told her not to worry and started helping her pick up the broken pieces. After about a minute, the store manager came and knelt beside us and said, "Leave it, we will clean this up."

The lady, totally embarrassed said, "I need to pay for all this." The manager smiled, helped her to her feet and said, "No ma'am, we have insurance for this, you do not have to pay anything!"



If you have read this far, give me another minute.

Wherever you are, close your eyes, and imagine God doing the same for you! Imagine the broken pieces of your mistakes or the pieces of your broken heart from all the blows life has thrown at you all over the floor and you're there trying to collect all of the pieces and fix them yourself.

Now imagine God comes and kneels right down beside you, smiles and says to you, "Leave it all there, We will clean this up for you!"

God loves you that much and wants to clean up the mess and put your broken heart back together if you will let Him!

With Him we have this insurance and it's called GRACE!

It's free! All you have to do is step aside from the mess of life and ask God to forgive you for the mess in your life, ask God to help you, and to renew you. He's faithful, I promise!

What a wonderful and amazing message communicated to us in a simple story about the love of God. A GRACE filled love that is beyond our understanding however it is not beyond our grasp for God does indeed reach out to us in the aisle of our lives and calls us to stand up and walk away from the mess and to trust him to sort it out.

Do you know God? Have you heard the Good News?

Take time to reread the story and ponder upon its message and ask yourself do I know this God who come alongside me and forgives me. The God who doesn't force us to clean up the mess or pay the cost but on our behalf does this for us. Being forgiven God allows us to walk away from the mess with the assurance that we are loved and cared for by the everlasting God who does not grow tired or weary of us and promises to renew and strengthen us.

*If you have been to any of our Messy Church activities you may like to check out the Holiday club for a list of fun activities stories and other whacky activities.*



# Film Night


## “the true cost?”




