


Weekly News from St Leonard's and St Mary's

THE LITURGY OF THE WORD

A reading from 2nd Corinthians 4:14-18

We know that the one who raised the Lord Jesus from the dead will also raise us with Jesus and present us with you to himself. All this is for your benefit, so that the grace that is reaching more and more people may cause thanksgiving to overflow to the glory of God.

Therefore we do not lose heart. Though outwardly we are wasting away, inwardly we are being renewed day by day. For our light and momentary troubles are achieving for us an eternal glory that far outweighs them all. So we fix our eyes not on what is seen, but on what is unseen, since what is seen is temporary, but what is unseen is eternal.

The Gospel

Hear the Gospel of the Lord according to Luke 23:33-43 Glory to Christ our Saviour.

When they came to the place called the Skull, they crucified Jesus, along with two criminals, one on his right, the other on his left.

Jesus cried out, "Father, forgive them, for they do not know what they are doing." And they divided up his clothes by casting lots and above him there was a written notice, which read: this is the king of the Jews.

The people stood watching, and the Synagogue rulers sneered at him and said, "He saved others; let him save himself if he is indeed God's Messiah, the Chosen One." The soldiers also came up and mocked him and offered him wine vinegar and said, "If you are the king of the Jews, save yourself." One of the criminals who hung there also hurled insults at him: "Aren't you the Messiah? Save yourself and us!"

But the other criminal rebuked him. "Don't you fear God," he said, "since you are under the same sentence? We are punished justly, for we are getting what our deeds deserve. But this man has done nothing wrong."

Then he said, "Jesus, remember me when you come into your kingdom." Jesus answered him, "Truly I tell you, today you will be with me in paradise.".

At end: Give thanks to the Lord for his glorious Gospel.

Glory and thanksgiving be to you, most loving Father, for the gift of your Son born in human flesh.

He is the Word existing beyond time, both source and final purpose, bringing to wholeness all that is made.

Obedient to your will he died upon the Cross. By your power you raised him from the dead. He broke the bonds of evil and set your people free to be his Body in the world. On the night when he was given up to death, knowing that his hour had come, having loved his own, he loved them to the end. At supper with his disciples he took bread and offered you thanks. He broke the bread, and gave it to them, saying: 'Take, eat. This is my Body: it is broken for you.'

After supper, he took the cup, he offered you thanks, and gave it to them saying: 'Drink this, all of you. This is my Blood of the new covenant; it is poured out for you, and for all, that sins may be forgiven. Do this in remembrance of me.'

We now obey your Son's command.
We recall his blessed passion and death,
his glorious resurrection and ascension;
and we look for the coming of his Kingdom.
Made one with him, we offer you these gifts
and with them ourselves, a single, holy, living sacrifice.

Hear us, most merciful Father, and send your Holy Spirit upon us and upon this bread and this wine, that, overshadowed by his life-giving power, they may be the Body and Blood of your Son, and we may be kindled with the fire of your love and renewed for the service of your Kingdom.

Help us, who are baptised into the fellowship of Christ's Body to live and work to your praise and glory; may we grow together in unity and love until at last, in your new creation, we enter into our heritage in the company of the Virgin Mary, the apostles and prophets, and of all our brothers and sisters living and departed

Through Jesus Christ our Lord, with whom, and in whom, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, all honour and glory be to you, Lord of all ages, world without end. **Amen.**

Scottish Episcopal Church Mission Association

The work of SECMA often happens quietly and is probably not as well known as the larger more prominent Mission Charities like the Church Mission Society, Tearfund or Christian Aid.

Nevertheless SECMA although a small association is one of the ways in which the Scottish Episcopal Churches responses to poverty around the world.

Relief of poverty takes many forms. In many cases, helping children (particularly girls) to gain an education is a vital tool in preventing poverty in the future. In other situations, providing the funds to build a piggery or a poultry unit helps to provide employment and food in the short term.

We also help with several HIV prevention projects (along with help for those living and dying from HIV in countries without a health service), and we also help to keep vital resources open for the elderly. We support many projects in Africa, but also cover India, Asia, South America and Eastern Europe.


FILM NIGHT 'Thank you for the Rain'


