From the Rector



This verse from Lamentations (3: 21-24)
is written in a time of distress and turmoil.

***"Then I remember something
that fills me with HOPE.
The Lord's kindness never fails! ...
The Lord can always be trusted
to show mercy each morning.
Deep in my heart I say,
"The Lord is all I need; I can depend on him!"***

Over the four weeks of Advent we embrace four Advent themes as we journey towards Bethlehem and the celebration of the birth of Christ our Saviour. These four themes are Hope, Peace, Joy and Love.

Advent is about waiting and preparing for that which is to come. With hope filled with the assurance of God's promises we recall the promises of old that led up to the birth of Jesus. His birth fulfilled the hope that the people and prophets of old held onto. They placed their hope in God, in the Lord God who is faithful and in his time fulfils all his promises. Christmas celebrates that God is trustworthy and true and our hope is secure in him. As we await the return of Christ again we can have the assurance that even today God remains faithful and true and therefore our hope is not misplaced. Just as Jesus was born in fulfillment to the promises of old so to the promises of his return will one day come to pass. We place our hope in these promises that one day we when Christ shall return all wars will cease, pain and sorrow will be no more and every tear will be wiped away and the Lord will make all things new. We place our trust in God and hold on to these promises and look forward with hope.

During Advent we invite you to come and visit your church garden and take time to reflect and ponder on the meaning of Christmas and on the themes of Advent. We will be putting in place four large stones one for each week of Advent which will lead us in time to the Nativity scene which will be built up over the next few weeks. Feel free to come and ponder and ask God to renew your hope and trust in his promises.

The Collect

Hear the Gospel of our Lord according to Luke 21 v 25-36

Glory to Christ our Saviour.

Jesus said 'There will be signs in the sun, moon and stars. On the earth, nations will be in anguish and perplexity at the roaring and tossing of the sea. People will faint from terror, apprehensive of what is coming on the world, for the heavenly bodies will be shaken. At that time they will see the Son of Man coming in a cloud with power and great glory.

When these things begin to take place, stand up and lift up your heads, because your redemption is drawing near.'

He told them this parable: 'Look at the fig-tree and all the trees. When they sprout leaves, you can see for yourselves and know that summer is near. Even so, when you see these things happening, you know that the kingdom of God is near. 'Truly I tell you, this generation will certainly not pass away until all these things have happened. Heaven and earth will pass away, but my words will never pass away.

Be careful, or your hearts will be weighed down with carousing, drunkenness and the anxieties of life, and that day will close on you suddenly like a trap. For it will come on all those who live on the face of the whole earth. Be always on the watch, and pray that you may be able to escape all that is about to happen, and that you may be able to stand before the Son of Man.

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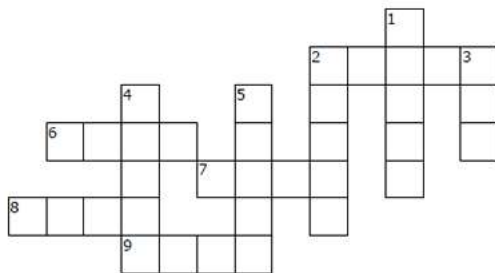
