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How to help the vulnerable caught in Ukraine crisis

The conflict unfolding in Ukraine following invasion by Russian forces has been a shocking sight to witness over the past week. Civilians are under attack and many thousands have had to flee Ukraine as refugees.

Many of us have rightly asked: how can we help? What can we do to support those who find themselves involved in a war they do not want? Local initiatives are taking place across the country to provide funds and supplies for the vulnerable and those whose lives are at risk, and international aid agencies are appealing for support.

Groundwork

Preparing and exploring the future of our churches

I warmly welcome you to this weeks Sunday Worship as we begin the season of Lent. Lent is often viewed as a season of preparation as we look forward to the great and marvellous celebration of Easter. Being a season of preparation we are going to use the next few weeks to do some groundwork as we begin the process of visioning, exploring our hopes and dreams for the future of St Leonard's and St Mary's.

Before we start making decisions about the future we want to revisit and ground ourselves in our faith and understanding of who and what we are called to be as individuals and collectively as a church family. Through prayer and understanding who, and whose we are, and what we have been called to do, will then help shape and focus our response.

Each Sunday we will explore briefly a different theme or aspect of the groundwork of our faith. Alongside this our Homegroups (Monday and Tuesday Evenings) will also use their time to pray and more fully engage with the topic. We want to hear your feedback and thoughts about each weeks topic. What words, thoughts or ideas came to mind as you engaged with the topic? What questions did it raise? We hope that in time this will be a useful record of our journey and feed into the next part of the visioning process as we begin to explore our dreams and hopes for the future.

Lent is only the beginning of a process that we hope will lead us to thinking about new life at Easter and onward in to what is to come.

Group Discussions.

In a small group of 4/5 people take time to read the passages of scripture and consider some of the questions being asked.

Isaiah 49:15 –16

Can a mother forget the baby at her breast and have no compassion on the child she has borne? Though she may forget, I will not forget you! See, I have engraved you on the palms of my hands;

Matthew 10:29-33

Jesus said "Are not two sparrows sold for a penny? Yet not one of them will fall to the ground outside your Father's care." "And even the very hairs of your head are all numbered. So don't be afraid; you are worth more than many sparrows."

- To what extent does the scriptures say that God knows us?
- How precious do you think we are to God?
- Does what we do, or don't do, affect God's love for us?
- God believes in me! What does this statement mean to you?
- Does knowing that God believes in you, and loves you, change how you should live your life? Why?

Psalm 139 reminds us that God formed us and knows all our days. That includes both the joys and sorrows of each day:

- What gives you joy?
- What trials or difficulties are you facing personally?
- What trials and difficulties are we facing as a church?
- What joys are there currently in the life of this church?

Eucharistic Prayer

We, who by Christ's power follow the way of the Cross, sharing the joy of his obedience, now offer you our praise, with angels and archangels and the whole company of heaven singing the hymn of your unending glory.

Holy, Holy, Holy Lord, God of power and might. Heaven and earth are full of your glory. Hosanna in the highest. Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord. Hosanna in the highest.

Glory and thanksgiving be to you, most loving Father, for Christ in whom the world is reconciled. Lifted on the cross, his suffering and forgiveness spanned the gulf of our sins had made. Through the dark struggle death was swallowed up in victory that life and light might reign.

Hear us, most merciful Father, and send your Holy Spirit upon us and upon this bread and this wine, that, overshadowed by his life-giving power, they may be the Body and Blood of your Son, and we may be kindled with the fire of your love and renewed for the service of your Kingdom.

Help us, who are baptised into the fellowship of Christ's Body to live and work to your praise and glory; may we grow together in unity and love until at last, in your new creation, we enter into our heritage in the company of the Virgin Mary, the apostles, and prophets, and of all our brothers and sisters living and departed.

Through Jesus Christ our Lord, with whom, and in whom, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, all honour and glory be to you, Lord of all ages, world without end. **Amen**.
