Reading Colossians 1:15-29

The Son is the image of the invisible God, the firstborn over all creation. For in him all things were created: things in heaven and on earth, visible and invisible, whether thrones or powers or rulers or authorities; all things have been created through him and for him. He is before all things, and in him all things hold together. And he is the head of the body, the church; he is the beginning and the firstborn from among the dead

so that in everything he might have the supremacy.

For God was pleased to have all his fullness dwell in him, and through him to reconcile to himself all things, whether things on earth or things in heaven,

by making peace through his blood, shed on the cross.

Once you were alienated from God and were enemies in your minds because of your evil behaviour. But now he has reconciled you by Christ's physical body through death to present you holy in his sight, without blemish and free from accusation – if you continue in your faith, established and firm, and do not move from the hope held out in the gospel. This is the gospel that you heard and that has been proclaimed to every creature under heaven, and of which I, Paul, have become a servant.

Now I rejoice in what I am suffering for you, and I fill up in my flesh what is still lacking in regard to Christ's afflictions, for the sake of his body, which is the church. I have become its servant by the commission God gave me to present to you the word of God in its fullness the mystery that has been kept hidden for ages and generations, but is now disclosed to the Lord's people. To them God has chosen to make known among the Gentiles the glorious riches of this mystery, which is Christ in you, the hope of glory.

He is the one we proclaim, admonishing and teaching everyone with all wisdom, so that we may present everyone fully mature in Christ. To this end I strenuously contend with all the energy Christ so powerfully works in me.

Send your Holy Spirit on us and on this bread and this wine; that they may be the Body and Blood of Christ, and that, sharing your life, we may travel in your company to our journey's end.

With all your people, we give you thanks and praise through the Son and in the Spirit, now and for ever. Amen.

The Visioning Questionnaire - a Summary

There was a good response rate to our recent Visioning Questionnaire that was issued as part of our Visioning exercise that we have been engaging in over the last few months. The full responses have been issued to the Clergy Team and Vestry members for them to ponder over. We are planning to issue a summary or coalition of the responses and make this available to the wider congregation in the coming weeks.

However, before then I thought I would give you a taste of some of the responses from the first 4 questions of the questionnaire for this week and offer a personal reflection or a response to what has been received.

Q1 Why do you come to church?

For Worship, Fellowship, the Eucharist, Spiritual nourishment, the Singing and Bible teaching

I say amen to all of these. We / I come to worship the Lord who loves us, to sing his praises, to read his word and grow in knowledge of his ways, while through the Eucharist we celebrate and giving thanks for his life, death and resurrection. Spiritually renewed we go out to love and serve the Lord.

Q2 What do you find helpful and unhelpful about your church?

Helpful: The beauty and quiet of the building, our style of services, that we are a welcoming church, the Minister is easy to talk to and has a good ministry support team. People care and look out for each other especially during the Pandemic.

Unhelpful: Times of the Sunday service, that the Rector is not able to stay longer at St. Marys . Music — some responses calling for more contemporary worship while others questioning the appropriateness of song choices or too many new ones. A call for a simpler liturgy and a response criticising the lack of leadership skills and professionalism of the Rector and Clergy Team.

There are clearly some interesting divergences raised by this question which we all will need to reflect on. Our style of worship is loved by some while others are calling for a more simpler approach. Last week I wrote about the Liturgy and some of the options available to us. So I refer you to last weeks Connect. Equally I am aware that music in church can sadly be divisive. However, we should first and foremost come to worship with an attitude and desire to worship God. God is more concerned about our hearts and attitude to worship than he is about the style. In fact, I would say God loves all styles of worship if it is offered out of love and thanksgiving to the Lord. At my heart is the belief that we are a welcoming family church and therefore the songs and hymns chosen are drawn from a variety of sources.

I am reminded of one time at Theological college when a visiting Bishop came and joined us for worship. He was grieved that on that occasion we did not sing some well known Hymns for him to join in with. He said he was not against new songs but that we should limit them and only introduce them one or two maximum per service. As he was preaching the following evening he said he would choose the hymns for that service. The next night we were then introduced to five great hymns of the faith. Sadly for most of us we quickly had to learn these five new hymns that we had never heard of, that were sung to a strange meter and used language of a bygone era. Maybe musical styles are like marmite some are loved and others are frowned upon. As a point of information our hymns are normally selected to reflect the theme of the day set by the bible readings and are not just a list of Peter's favourites. Those preaching or presiding are also given permission to make song and hymn suggestions as well as changes to the Liturgy to reflect the theme or focus of the day. One of the benefits of being part of a church family is that together we can achieve and offer much more than we can on our own. I acknowledge that none of us are perfect or get it right all the time. We come as broken vessels, imperfect and flawed responding to God's call on our lives. We seek to be his people, learning and growing as disciples of Christ. Personally, I believe in a collaborative leadership style. Not a Father knows best approach, but come seeking a dialogue that will move us forward together into the future. This requires that we listen to each other and encourage one another through respecting and valuing what we each can bring and offer.

Q3 What talents/gifts/skills can you offer?

Clearly from the responses to this question we have a wide range of people with gifts and skills set and many of these are being used. As we seek to work together I am once again grateful for all the time and commitment that is given by many individuals to the work of the church and pray that through these endeavours we all will be blessed. At the end of the day we are all aware, I hope, that the church is about the people, loving and serving one another in the name of Jesus.

Q4 What do you hope your church will be like in 5 years (dream BIG)? Bigger congregation with more young people and families. A warmer church, new hall or money spent on renovating and improving the space within the church to be used. Songs or Praise type services, a choir, and outdoor worship

The question now is how do we begin to plant the seeds that will lead to a bigger congregation, with more young people and families. Messy Church is one activity. What other activities may we need to provide to help grow the church? Do we have a heart for the lost and the broken, the hungry and the poor? Are we open to offering family services with story and songs for children. Can the church be open as a place of sanctuary? Possibly open as a place for hot cup of soup and warmth during the winter months to help those facing unsurmountable increases in their cost of living? What is our focus and aim for the next 5 years and what steps will we need to take to move in that direction. These are just some of the questions that we all need to ask and especially the Vestry and Clergy Team.


