Hospitality All are Welcome.

Throughout the Bible, both in the Old and New Testaments there are stories and accounts of hospitality. Hospitality was and still is a very important issue within many cultures. To be welcomed in and to sit and eat with someone was and is a privilege that could lead to a deepening of a friendship and a relationship with the other that could be life long.

Abraham and Sarah, the great Father and Mother of the family of Israel were once visited by three people and in welcoming them they encountered God.

Many of Jesus discussions and teachings also focus around the simple act of hospitality. People would welcome Jesus to their home to get to know him better and maybe even to win favour with him and the community. However, Jesus would often use these opportunities to teach those around him lessons about the Kingdom of God. Our Gospel reading today is one of those occasions. As Jesus was invited into a leading Pharisee's house he noted how all the other guest jostled to find the best position. They were full of themselves, thinking that they were more important, or had a greater right to be seated nearest to the host. To keep in favour with each other they would invite each other to parties to show off, without a consideration for the poor and needy on their own doorstep.

Jesus of course challenged them and reminds us too that he is the God of the poor, the outcast and stranger. When we show love and are hospitable in our actions to the least of these, Jesus says that we are sharing our love and welcome with God. As we invite in the stranger and friend and gather round our table for worship we may in fact be entertaining angels or God himself. Who can tell which person God may have sent to bring us peace, joy or love and even maybe open our eyes to see God in our presence happy that we welcome everyone to come to the table and remember that we are all loved equally by the Lord and that there is a place at the table for you and me.

GospelHear the Gospel of our Lord according to Luke 14.1,7-14Glory to Christ our Saviour

One Sabbath, when Jesus went to eat in the house of a prominent Pharisee, he was being carefully watched.

When he noticed how the guests picked the places of honour at the table, he told them this parable: "When someone invites you to a wedding feast, do not take the place of honour, for a person more distinguished than you may have been invited. If so, the host who invited both of you will come and say to you, 'Give this person your seat.' Then, humiliated, you will have to take the least important place. But when you are invited, take the lowest place, so that when your host comes, he will say to you, 'Friend, move up to a better place.' Then you will be honoured in the presence of all the other guests. For all those who exalt themselves will be humbled, and those who humble themselves will be exalted."

Then Jesus said to his host, "When you give a luncheon or dinner, do not invite your friends, your brothers or sisters, your relatives, or your rich neighbours; if you do, they may invite you back and so you will be repaid. But when you give a banquet, invite the poor, the crippled, the lame, the blind, and you will be blessed.

Although they cannot repay you, you will be repaid at the resurrection of the righteous."

Pitcairn Bake Sales


Thursday 1st September
