# Sunday Services

There have been various discussion about our Sunday morning services over the last few months. This included the change of time to a 10am start and also some ponderings about what type or style of services we could offer. These discussions naturally have led to some concern and confusion about the future of worship at St Leonard's and St Mary's and the need to clarify they way forward for the foreseeable future. I therefore make the following statement to hopefully bring clarity regarding the future of our worship.

As Rector, and after consultation with the Clergy Team and Vestries of both churches, I give notice that the 10 am Sunday Service time will remain at 10am at both churches for the foreseeable future. The timing of the services will be further reviewed again in April.

The Clergy Team will endeavour to provide Eucharistic worship on a weekly basis at both churches. Nevertheless, the Clergy Team and I want to underline our concerns about the fragile nature of this arrangement which although sustainable in the short term over this next year or so it may not be possible to maintain this pattern of worship in the longer term

So going forward we will remain at 10am for Sunday Morning Worship and we will continue with the practice of celebrating the Eucharist every Sunday. The Clergy Team will operate across the linked charge and as Rector I will continue the pattern of being present on the 1st and 3rd Sundays at St Mary's and 2nd & 4th Sundays at St Leonard's.

## **THE GOSPEL READING    MATTHEW 13:3-23**

*When the Gospel is announced we say together*  
**Glory to Christ our Saviour**

Jesus told them many things in parables, saying:  
A farmer went out to sow his seed. As he was scattering the seed, some fell along the path, and the birds came and ate it up. Some fell on rocky places, where it did not have much soil. It sprang up quickly, because the soil was shallow. But when the sun came up, the plants were scorched, and they withered because they had no root.

Other seed fell among thorns, which grew up and choked the plants. 8 Still other seed fell on good soil, where it produced a crop – a hundred, sixty or thirty times what was sown.  
Whoever has ears, let them hear.'

The disciples came to Jesus and asked, 'Why do you speak to the people in parables?' He replied, Because the knowledge of the secrets of the kingdom of heaven have been given to you, but not to them. Whoever has will be given more, and they will have an abundance. Whoever does not have, even what they have will be taken from them. This is why I speak to them in parables:

'Though seeing, they do not see;  
  though hearing, they do not hear or understand.  
In them is fulfilled the prophecy of Isaiah:  
"You will be ever hearing but never understanding;  
  you will be ever seeing but never perceiving.  
For this people's heart has become calloused;  
  they hardly hear with their ears,  
  and they have closed their eyes.

Otherwise they might see with their eyes,  
hear with their ears,  
understand with their hearts  
and turn, and I would heal them.”

But blessed are your eyes because they see, and your ears because they hear. For truly I tell you, many prophets and righteous people longed to see what you see but did not see it, and to hear what you hear but did not hear it.

Listen then to what the parable of the sower means: when anyone hears the message about the kingdom and does not understand it, the evil one comes and snatches away what was sown in their heart. This is the seed sown along the path. The seed falling on rocky ground refers to someone who hears the word and at once receives it with joy. But since they have no root, they last only a short time. When trouble or persecution comes because of the word, they quickly fall away.

The seed falling among the thorns refers to someone who hears the word, but the worries of this life and the deceitfulness of wealth choke the word, making it unfruitful. However, the seed falling on good soil refers to someone who hears the word and understands. This is the one who produces a crop, yielding a hundred, sixty or thirty times what was sown.’
