I was shocked and sickened to hear that there had been a theft at St Mary's last Sunday and that a member's personal belongings had been stolen from within the church during our time of fellowship and refreshments.

We have worked hard at being a welcoming church that offers everyone a safe place to gather and find hope. Sadly, although we should indeed keep our doors and hearts open to people coming in and warmly welcome them, we need also to be aware that not every soul that enters in is filled with good intentions.

I am appalled that I have to write this but I want to encourage each of us to be aware of our own personal belongings at all times. Along with this we need to be watchful and if we do see someone's unattended belongs to keep and eye on them and remind them that they are there.

We long for our church buildings to be used, to be indeed a welcoming safe place for all. In the coming months both our churches will be exploring how to be open more. In being open we hope to offer a place that people can come and just be and in being in theses special places may encounter and draw closer to God who offers us hope for today and tomorrow. As part of that plan CCTV will be installed at St Mary's in the coming week and at St Leonard's some of the Pastoral Team are exploring the possibility of opening the church up one day a week. We might even explore whether we could offer to be a "warm place" to help those in need at this time of escalating heating costs.

So let us not be disempowered by acts of evil but instead be empowered by God to respond with acts of love in Jesus name.

Reading Philemon 1-21

Paul, a prisoner of Christ Jesus, and Timothy our brother,

To Philemon our dear friend and fellow worker and also to Apphia our sister and Archippus our fellow soldier and to the church that meets in your home:

Grace and peace to you from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ.

I always thank my God as I remember you in my prayers, because I hear about your love for all his holy people and your faith in the Lord Jesus. I pray that your partnership with us in the faith may be effective in deepening your understanding of every good thing we share for the sake of Christ. Your love has given me great joy and encouragement, because you, brother, have refreshed the hearts of the Lord's people. Although, in Christ I could be bold and order you to do what you ought to do, yet I prefer to appeal to you on the basis of love. It is as none other than Paul – an old man and now also a prisoner of Christ Jesus that I appeal to you for my son Onesimus who became my son while I was in chains. Formerly he was useless to you, but now he has become useful both to you and to me.

I am sending him, who is my very heart, back to you. I would have liked to keep him with me so that he could take your place in helping me while I am in chains for the gospel. But I did not want to do anything without your consent, so that any favour you do would not seem forced but would be voluntary. Perhaps the reason he was separated from you for a little while was that you might have him back for ever, no longer as a slave, but better than a slave, as a brother. He is very dear to me but even dearer to you, both as a fellow man and as a brother in the Lord.

So if you consider me a partner, welcome him as you would welcome me. If he has done you any wrong or owes you anything, charge it to me. I, Paul, am writing this with my own hand. I will pay it back; not to mention that you owe me your very self. I do wish, brother, that I may have some benefit from you in the Lord; refresh my heart in Christ.

Confident of your obedience, I write to you, knowing that you will do even more than I ask.

Large crowds were travelling with Jesus, and turning to them he said: 'If anyone comes to me and does not hate father and mother, wife and children, brothers and sisters – yes, even their own life – such a person cannot be my disciple. And whoever does not carry their cross and follow me cannot be my disciple.

'Suppose one of you wants to build a tower. Won't you first sit down and estimate the cost to see if you have enough money to complete it? For if you lay the foundation and are not able to finish it, everyone who sees it will ridicule you, saying, "This person began to build and wasn't able to finish."

'Or suppose a king is about to go to war against another king. Won't he first sit down and consider whether he is able with ten thousand men to oppose the one coming against him with twenty thousand? If he is not able, he will send a delegation while the other is still a long way off and will ask for terms of peace. In the same way, those of you who do not give up everything you have cannot be my disciples.

The Lord be with you. **And also with you**.

Let us give thanks to the Lord our God. It is right to give him thanks and praise. Worship and praise belong to you, O God, Creator of all things visible and invisible, Source of life and immortality, Whom the heavens praise, the sun and moon and all the stars, the earth, the sea and all that is in them, in every place and at all times.

By your holy Word you brought order out of chaos. you divided light from darkness, created the heavens and established the earth; you divided the sea from the dry land, and caused all life to come into being. When you had made the plants and the animals, you formed us in your own image, and entrusted us with the priesthood of your Creation.

In Christ your holy Word became flesh, took our human form, lived among us, and, through dying on the cross, overcame sin and death, that your creation might be restored in him.

Through your life-giving Holy Spirit Who first moved over the waters, you renew your creation, call us to new birth, in a world restored by love.

As children of your redeeming purpose, with all your creatures throughout space and time we offer you our praise, together with angels and archangels and the whole company of heaven singing the hymn of your unending glory:

Holy, Holy, Holy Lord, God of power and might. Heaven and earth are full of your glory. Hosanna in the highest. Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord. Hosanna in the highest. Glory and thanksgiving be to you, God our creator, for the gift of your Son born in human flesh. Christ is your holy Wisdom, existing beyond time, present at creations birth. Through Christ you revealed yourself in the world, and bring your saving work to its completion. Obedient to your will he died upon the Cross. By your power you raised him from the dead. He broke the bonds of evil and set your people free to be his Body in the world.

On the night when he was given up to death, knowing that his hour had come, having loved his own, he loved them to the end. At supper with his disciples he took bread and offered you thanks. He broke the bread, and gave it to them, saying: "Take, eat. This is my Body: it is broken for you." After supper, he took the cup, he offered you thanks, and gave it to them saying: "Drink this, all of you. This is my Blood of the new covenant; it is poured out for you, and for all,

that sins may be forgiven.

Do this in remembrance of me."

We now obey your Son's command. We recall his blessed passion and death, his glorious resurrection and ascension; and we look for the coming of his Kingdom. Made one with him, we offer you these gifts and with them ourselves, a single, holy, living sacrifice. Hear us, most merciful Father, and send your Holy Spirit upon us and upon this bread and this wine, that, overshadowed by the Spirit's life-giving power, they may be the Body and Blood of your Son, and we may be kindled with the fire of your love and renewed for the service of your Kingdom.

Help us, who are baptised into the fellowship of Christ's Body to live and work to your praise and glory; may we grow together in unity and love until at last, in your new creation, we enter into our heritage in the company of the Virgin Mary, the apostles and prophets, and of all our brothers and sisters living and departed.

Through Jesus Christ our Lord, with whom, and in whom, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, all honour and glory be to you, Lord of all ages, world without end. **Amen.**

What is the Season of Creation?

The call for a "Season of Creation" within the worshiping life of the church has been in response to the churches growing understanding of global environmental issues brought about by climate change.

As we look out at the world we can physically see that our world so precious to us is undergoing some extreme weather patterns. While we have horrific floods in Pakistan, while raging wildfires destroyed crops and households in other parts of the world as well as here in the UK where we experienced one of its hottest summers on record.


Our worship should not be disengaged from the concerns of the world and so our provincial Faith and Order Board and College of Bishops have approved the introduction of a Season of Creation to our liturgical calendar. It is hoped that through these new liturgies being used in worship and the preaching of our faith that God created the world, and that it is good, and we, as human beings created in God's image, have a unique responsibility for the care of the planet, its wildlife and environments.

The Season of Creation runs from the first Sunday of September for five weeks, and often coincides with Harvest Thanksgivings which can be incorporated in the celebration of this season.


