Weekly News from St Leonard's and St Mary's 3rd Sunday of Advent - Joy



Dear Friends,

This third week of Advent has the theme of Joy. Our joy however, is not about some form of cheery denial that we erect to keep us away from facing the realities of life around us. No, as Christians our joy comes from knowing that even through the darkest days Jesus is our Lord who has conquered the darkness of sin and death.

Many Psychologists recognise that joy is one of the primary universal emotions amongst humans and possibly many animals. We can however assume that being joyful is a spontaneous emotional reaction caused by some event, the meeting with people who love us or seeing wonderful sights may bring us to a time of Joy. Likewise, hearing amazing news can fill us with joy. All these can be spontaneous and bring the blessing of joy. Nevertheless as Christians we can also deliberately choose to recount the goodness of our Lord and even though we are in difficult places learn to praise God through the darkest of times.

In the Psalms, we find numerous recitation of genuine troubles, hardship, fear and persecution, even the sense that God is absent. These laments, however are usually then followed by verses of rejoicing in the God, to remember the Lord who will not abandon them, who in some way will make things right. The perspective shifts from the here and now to the eternal; the present troubles are now, but in the schemes of eternity, goodness and righteousness will flourish and sorrow and sighing will flee away.

This deliberate turning to rejoicing is not a shying away from the reality of sadness, pain and distress. Instead it is about drawing on a deep sense of joy at being known and loved by God. It links to thankfulness and hope. The medieval mystic Julian of Norwich wrote out of her own experience of suffering about the love and joy to be found in her faith. In God, she tells us in 'Revelations of Divine Love', "All shall be well and all shall be well and all manner of things shall be well." So let us count our blessings and name them one by one and rejoice in what the Lord has done for us and will do for us. with peace and love, Peter

Reading of Scripture Isaiah 35.1-10

The glory of Lebanon will be given to it, the splendour of Carmel and Sharon;

they will see the glory of the Lord, the splendour of our God.

Strengthen the feeble hands, steady the knees that give way; say to those with fearful hearts 'Be strong, do not fear; your God will come, he will come to save you.'

Then will the eyes of the blind be opened and the ears of the deaf unstopped. Then will the lame leap like a deer, and the mute tongue shout for joy.

Water will gush forth in the wilderness and streams in the desert. The burning sand will become a pool, the thirsty ground bubbling springs. In the haunts where jackals once lay, grass and reeds and papyrus will grow.

And a highway will be there; it will be called the Way of Holiness; it will be for those who walk on that Way. The unclean will not journey on it, the wicked will not go about on it. No lion, nor any ravenous beast will be found there.

But only the redeemed will walk there, and those the Lord has rescued will return. They will enter Zion with singing; everlasting joy will crown their heads. Gladness and joy will overtake them, and sorrow and sighing will flee away.

Hear the Gospel of the Lord according to Matthew 11.2-11 Glory to Christ our Saviour.

A man dressed in fine clothes? No, those who wear fine clothes are in kings' palaces. Then what did you go out to see? A prophet? Yes, I tell you, and more than a prophet. This is the one about whom it is written:

"I will send my messenger ahead of you, who will prepare your way before you."

Truly I tell you, among those born of women there has not risen anyone greater than John the Baptist; yet whoever is least in the kingdom of heaven is greater than he.

As an Eco Congregation we are all conscious about the cost of heating and the environmental impacts and desire to reduce our carbon footprint.

Over the last few years there has been an increasing concern about both churches and how we can continue to use them and heat them more effectively. Now with ever increasing energy bills and concern about the need to continue to reduce our carbon footprint we need to begin to seriously look at replacing our old heating systems.

The Heathack organisation is coming alongside Community Organisations like churches and is offering us the opportunity over Four group sessions to better understand our buildings usage, heating system and how to strategically think about the future.

It is hoped that these sessions working in partnership with a Volunteer Engineer will help us better understand the needs and usages of the buildings while gaining a greater knowledge about heating, ventilation, and energy efficiency. Alongside this we will also look at what is practical and possible before making recommendations to the Vestry of each church. In time we hope this will give us the knowledge and capacity to make good decisions about what we can do for the future to enhance the use of our buildings and keep them comfortably warm and usable.


