Dear Friends,

As Advent begins we light our first candle to symbolise hope. Hope in an ancient story of long ago passed down from generation to generation. Hope in the darkness of life, within the horrors of war, within the pain and the struggles of life.

Hope like a candle being touched by a flame needs to be rekindled in us by the presence of God around us. As we remember the promises of old and there fulfilment may we be encouraged to place our hope afresh in God. God promised and it came to pass. Yes it took many years, many struggles and challenges along the way but the promised hope of a Messiah was sown among the people and in God's timing came to pass in the birth of Jesus.

At times we may indeed wonder, where is God? It is then as we cry out from our brokenness within the brokenness of the world that we need to hold on to the promises of God. For one day what we are going through will pass away. Jesus himself faced the despair of the Garden of Gethsemane, the pain, the sorrow of the heavy burden placed upon him before the joy dawned again on Easter Sunday.

The Gospel Reading

Hear the Gospel of the Lord according to Matthew 24.36-44 Glory to Christ our Saviour.

Hear us, most merciful Father, and send your Holy Spirit upon us and upon this bread and this wine, that, overshadowed by his life-giving power, they may be the Body and Blood of your Son, and we may be kindled with the fire of your love and renewed for the service of your Kingdom.

Help us, who are baptised into the fellowship of Christ's Body to live and work to your praise and glory; may we grow together in unity and love until at last, in your new creation, we enter into our heritage in the company of the Virgin Mary, the apostles and prophets, and of all our brothers and sisters living and departed.

Through Jesus Christ our Lord, with whom, and in whom, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, all honour and glory be to you, Lord of all ages, world without end.



THE LINK BOOK CLUB


O CALEDONIA

This book by Elspeth Barker has been described as the "best least-known novel of the twentieth century". It is a dark and sometimes disturbing book about Janet who lives with her dysfunctional family in a cold dank stately home,

Auchnasaugh, somewhere in Aberdeenshire. Janet is eccentric, unpopular and sometimes wicked, not a likeable character, and we follow her short life as she is murdered on the first page at 16! There are moments of black hilarity and also sadness as Janet is isolated, finding solace in animals and her books. Elspeth Barker wrote the most wonderful prose but sadly did not write any other novels, concentrating on writing reviews and poetry.

Our next book is "The call of the Cormorant" by Donald Murray and we meet again at St. Mary's on January 27th. All are welcome to join us.
