

Rob Burrows is a retired international rugby league player who sadly developed motor neuron disease (MND). This book was written by Rob himself and tells the story of his life thus far – his rugby days, his diagnosis and his current state of health. We all agreed that there were far too much rugby details in the book but it did demonstrate the courage of the man, especially as he is very small and was initially ridiculed for even attempting to play rugby which is for big burly characters! As the story unfolds, the diagnosis made and the limiting symptoms take hold

of Rob, we were inspired by his openness and acceptance of his condition. Of course Stephen Hawkin and Doddie Weir both had MND but Rob certainly brought it into the public domain and he has done some amazing fund raising for research into the disease which sadly has no cure. What also

came through the chapters of the book was the love and support of his rugby colleagues and his family especially his wife.
