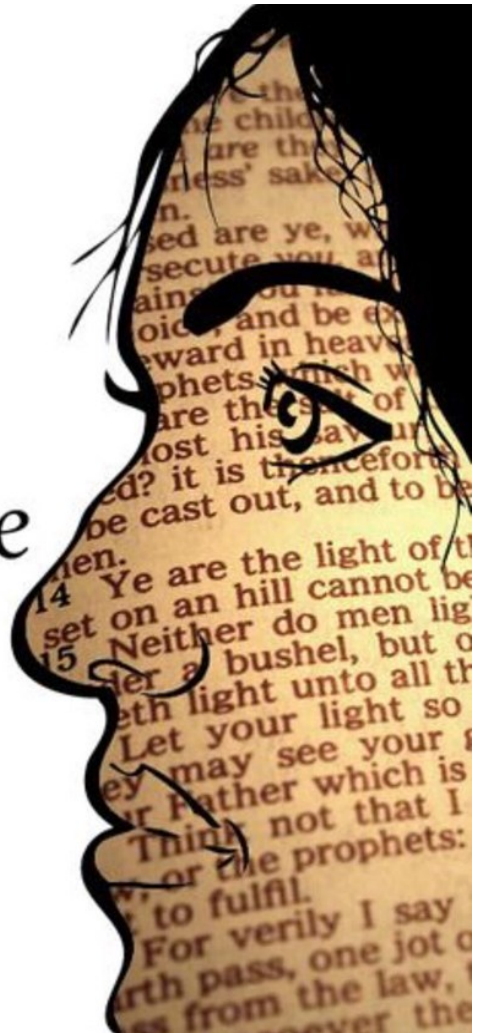

How should we respond was the question I asked last Sunday to the news of attacks in Israel. The answer and call firstly is for us to pray. Pray for peace. Justin Welby Archbishop of Canterbury and Archbishop Hosam Haoum of Jerusalem have written the following pieces as part of their response:

Archbishop Justin Welby writes: "We are grieved and deeply concerned at the violence in Israel and Gaza, and we unequivocally condemn the attacks by Hamas. We pray for those who are mourning, those who are injured, and all those fearing for their safety. We pray for restraint on all sides, and renewed efforts towards a just peace for all. The way forward must be for both sides to build confidence in a secure future through which Israel and its people can live in security within its internationally recognised borders, and Palestinians have their own state and live in their lands in security, and with peace and justice."

Archbishop Hosam Naoum of Jerusalem described the blast at the Anglican Al-Ahli Arab Hospital in Gaza City as a "dreadful and devastating massacre". He offers the wider church the following prayer which is commended for us to use as we pray for peace.

O God of all justice and peace, we cry out to you  
in the midst of the pain and trauma of violence and fear  
which prevails within the Holy Land.

Be with those who need you in these days of suffering;  
we pray for people of all faiths - Jews, Muslims and Christians  
and for all the people of the Holy Land.

We pray to you, O Lord,  
for an end to violence, the establishment of peace,  
and call out to you, to bring justice and equity to all people.

Guide us into your kingdom  
where all people are treated with dignity and honour.

In Jesus' name we pray. Amen.

## A READING FROM SCRIPTURE 1 Thessalonians 1.1-10

Paul, Silas and Timothy, To the church of the Thessalonians in God the Father and the Lord Jesus Christ: Grace and peace to you.

We always thank God for all of you and continually mention you in our prayers. We remember before our God and Father your work produced by faith, your labour prompted by love, and your endurance inspired by hope in our Lord Jesus Christ.

For we know, brothers and sisters loved by God, that he has chosen you, because our gospel came to you not simply with words but also with power, with the Holy Spirit and deep conviction.

You know how we lived among you for your sake. You became imitators of us and of the Lord, for you welcomed the message in the midst of severe suffering with the joy given by the Holy Spirit. And so you became a model to all the believers in Macedonia and Achaia. The Lord's message rang out from you not only in Macedonia and Achaia – your faith in God has become known everywhere.

Therefore we do not need to say anything about it, for they themselves report what kind of reception you gave us. They tell how you turned to God from idols to serve the living and true God, and to wait for his Son from heaven, whom he raised from the dead – Jesus, who rescues us from the coming wrath.

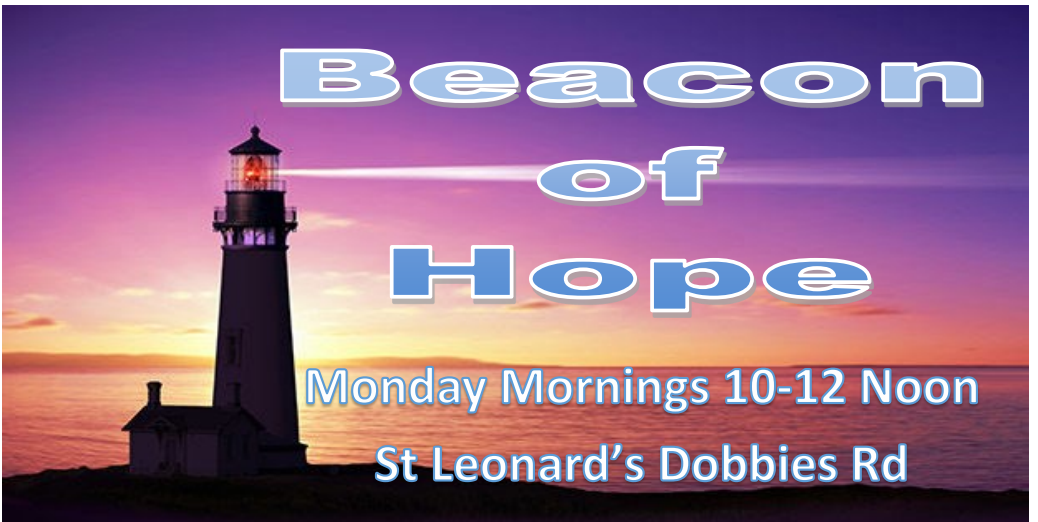

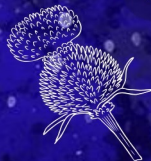

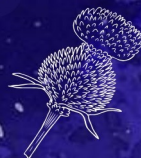
