

Café Church Worship for the Season of Creation: The 4 Elements of Nature

The Gathering

We gather in the name of God, Creator, Sustainer and Redeemer **Amen.**

GOSPEL READING:

Matthew 13: 1-9 The Parable of the Sower

That same day Jesus went out of the house and sat by the lake. Such large crowds gathered around him that he got into a boat and sat in it, while all the people stood on the shore.

Then he told them many things in parables, saying: "A farmer went out to sow his seed. As he was scattering the seed, some fell along the path, and the birds came and ate it up. Some fell on rocky places, where it did not have much soil. It sprang up quickly, because the soil was shallow. But when the sun came up, the plants were scorched, and they withered because they had no root. Other seed fell among thorns, which grew up and choked the plants. Still other seed fell on good soil, where it produced a crop—a hundred, sixty or thirty times what was sown.

Through Jesus Christ our Lord, with whom, and in whom, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, all honour and glory be to you, Lord of all ages, world without end.




Christmas Lunch

Our last venture was a crime novel set in Ireland in the early 1950's "The Lock-up" by John Banville. The body of a young woman is found in a lock-up garage (hence the title) an apparent suicide. However, pathologist Dr Quirke and Detective Inspector Strafford soon suspect foul play. The victim's sister, a newspaper reporter from London, returns to Dublin to join the two men in


their quest to uncover the truth. With relations between the two men increasingly strained, and their investigation taking them back to the final days of the Second World War, can they join the pieces of a hidden puzzle?

We found reading this novel as much of a study of two troubled men as it was a cunning murder mystery. This is the third in a series of Strafford and Quirke novels and I found it best to have read the other two beforehand.

(No1 "Snow" which introduced DI Strafford and No2 "April in Spain" which features Dr Quirke.). We all enjoyed the book with the usual mix of "red herrings" and plot twists.

"The Fellowship of Puzzle Makers" by Samuel Burr. is our next book and we meet at St Mary's on Fri 25th Oct 7.30pm.
