God, from whom all good things come, you shower us with many blessings and make us stewards of all that we have been given. Give us generous hearts, and make us cheerful givers, filled with the desire to see the advancement of the Kingdom of your Son, our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ. Amen.

The first reading A reading from 1 Corinthians 9 3-14

This is my defence to those who sit in judgment on me. Don't we have the right to food and drink? Don't we have the right to take a believing wife along with us, as do the other apostles and the Lord's brothers and Cephas? Or is it only I and Barnabas who lack the right to not work for a living?

Who serves as a soldier at his own expense? Who plants a vineyard and does not eat its grapes? Who tends a flock and does not drink the milk? Do I say this merely on human authority?

Doesn't the Law say the same thing? For it is written in the Law of Moses: "Do not muzzle an ox while it is treading out the grain." Is it about oxen that God is concerned? Surely he says this for us, doesn't he? Yes, this was written for us, because whoever ploughs and threshes should be able to do so in the hope of sharing in the harvest.

If we have sown spiritual seed among you, is it too much if we reap a material harvest from you? If others have this right of support from you, shouldn't we have it all the more? But we did not use this right. On the contrary, we put up with anything rather than hinder the gospel of Christ.

Don't you know that those who serve in the temple get their food from the temple, and that those who serve at the altar share in what is offered on the altar? In the same way, the Lord has commanded that those who preach the gospel should receive their living from the gospel.

This is the word of the Lord Thanks be to God.

Purpose in family


Purpose in friendship

BOOK CLUB

TRUE BIZ by SARA NOVIC


We had our belated Christmas lunch at the Cavalier in January and discussed our latest read.

This novel was probably written for young adults as the language is very "yoof" and "cool". The main character is a congenitally deaf teenager who had a malfunctioning cochlear implant inserted as a baby.

She was failing in her regular school and so was enrolled in an exclusively deaf school. Here she is taught sign language and a new world opens up for her in terms of communication and friendship.

There was much that we at the Book Club did not appreciate about the deaf world and there were many ethical issues raised e.g. should deaf children be implanted with cochlear implants as they may resent this as they get older, should there be different sign languages for different ethnic group (sign language used by black people is different from that used by white Europeans or even American Sign language).

Overall an enjoyable read altogether.


